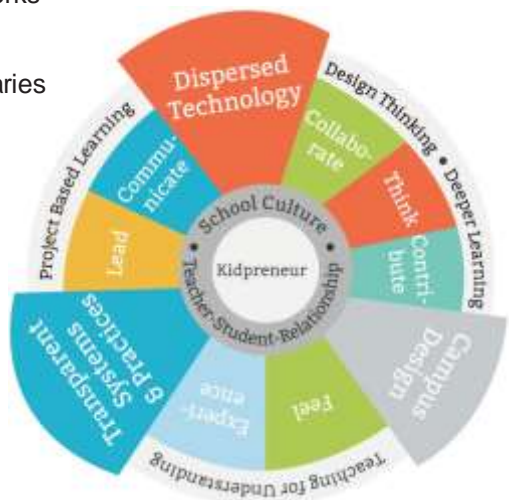

ACADEMIC MODEL

At Euphoria academic standards are high and love of learning is evident throughout the school. The curriculum involving experiential learning and activity-based approach is balanced with a range of real-world subjects from STREAM (Science, Technology, Robotics, Engineering, Arts and Maths) alongside Language, Social Studies, Music, Dance, Drama and Sports. SCHOOL RULES

1. Students should carry their Almanacs to school everyday with their photographs duly pasted and the identity information complete/duly signed by the parents.
2. Students who come to school by their own transport should arrive at school before ____am.
3. Students should be neatly dressed. The school uniform is to be worn everyday and for all school functions. Students who are sloppily dressed or not in proper uniform will be fined or marked absent for the day. They should wear their identity cards everyday.
4. Non-Sikh boys should get their haircut at regular intervals.
5. Students are expected to respect the property of others. They should also show respect for school property and no student should damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage things belonging to others. Damage done even by accident should be reported at once to the Class Educator or the Principal. Any damage done will be made good by the one who causes it.
6. Students are advised to keep their classrooms, school building/ campus as neat as possible and throw leftovers into the trash cans only.
7. Lending or borrowing of money and any other articles is not permitted.
8. The school is not responsible for goods lost. It is advisable not to bring valuable articles. They are also not allowed to wear jewellery in school. The school bears no responsibility for articles lost in school.
9. The school reserves the right to suspend or to take strict disciplinary actions against a student whose conduct is harmful to other students.
10. Parents and Guardians are not allowed to visit their wards or Educators in the classrooms, without the permission of the Principal. As far as possible, once a child has come to school he/she should not be asked to go on half a day or take leave from any period.
11. Parents / Guardians should sign their ward's Report Card within two days of the receipt of the same and send back to school.
12. The observance of rules of discipline of the school and good behavior is an essential condition to a student's continuance in the school. In case any student violates the school rules or indulges in any form of indiscipline, stringent action will be taken against the student.

13. No student will be allowed to go home without written permission of the Parent / Guardian.
14. Indiscipline behavior in the school buses will make the student ineligible to use the school transportation.
15. Parents should carry their Fetch Card when they come to receive their ward(s) at their designated bus stop.
16. Students are expected to converse only in English at all times.
17. There will be no retest if a student is absent.

FEE RULES

1. Fee collection hours: 9:00 am to 3:00 pm on all working days.
2. The last date of payment of fees shall be 5th of the respective month. Fee can be paid in lump sum for the session by availing a discount of 5% of total fees provided it is paid in a single instalment before 30th of June.
3. The fees can be deposited either at school through cash/cheque or online payment using the link available on the school's website. Parents who deposit fee using the online mode are requested to update the same in the school's Accounts department.
4. Always mention the Name/Class/Section/Admission no. of your ward while paying the school fee through internet banking / NEFT / Funds transfer / Cheque / DD / Pay Order.
5. In case of cheque dishonor and return unpaid by the bank for any reason, a penalty of Rs. 500 has to be paid by the parent along with fees in cash only at the accounts office in the school.
6. Late fee charges:
 - a. Rs. 10 per day (after 5th of respective month till 15th of the month).
 - b. Rs. 20 per day (16th onwards till whole fee is deposited).
7. In case the fees for consecutive two months stands overdue, the name of the ward is liable to be struck off the rolls without any prior information to the parents.
8. Even if the students are admitted later during the term, fees for the whole academic year will be charged.
9. Parents are requested to deposit the fees in time. Parents must keep fee receipt with them and should produce when required.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Parents are required to co-operate with the school in it's attempt to help their child/ children in progress and discipline and take interest in their child's studies and other instructions given.

19. Students suffering from any of the diseases like Asthma, Epilepsy, Rheumatic Heart diseases etc. are advised to be under continuous medical supervision of a specialist doctor. History of their illness must be filled in the Almanac along with the treatment being taken.
20. There will be a fruit break daily. Please ensure that your ward brings fruits daily.
21. Parents are to note that the school premise is a '**NO TOBACCO ZONE**'; they should follow this strictly when they enter the school.



SCHOOL LIBRARY

The school library is opened to all Bonafide students of the school. Students have to observe the following rules in the Library:

1. Silence should be maintained in the library at all times.
2. The books issued should be kept and returned in proper condition. Only one book will be issued at a time.
3. Books will be issued for only 7 days initially. If any student wants to retain the book further, he/she has to get them renewed.
4. Books should be returned on the due date, otherwise a fine of Rs. 5 per day will be charged thereafter.
5. Borrowers are responsible for every book taken by them and will be expected to pay for any book damaged or lost.
6. Personal belongings and eatables are not allowed in the library.
7. Record of the books issued from the library has to be maintained in the Library Record section of this Almanac.

BOOK STORE

The list of prescribed text books and notebooks are available in the school office for the parents to buy.

TRANSPORT/BUS

Buses operate on specific routes, depending on the number of students on that route. It is not practically possible to drop students at the door-step of their homes. On finalization of the route, no changes or diversions will be entertained, and parents are requested to co-operate. Parents are requested to consult the Transport-In-Charge regarding any transport matter.



BUS RULES

1. No student will be permitted to discontinue bus service in the middle of the year.
2. All students using the bus are expected to be at the bus stop atleast 10 minutes before the arrival of the bus.
3. The bus will not wait for more than 2 minutes at the stop.
4. The students should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives.
5. No student should come near the entry door of the bus until it has made a complete stop.
6. All students must occupy vacant seats immediately after boarding their buses. No student should travel standing on the foot board.
7. The drivers are authorized to stop buses at the designated stops only. The list of stops is made keeping in view the convenience and safety of all bus commuters and is always subject to change.
8. When the bus is in motion students must not move around on the bus nor must they expose their heads or arms outside the windows.
9. Students will be held responsible for any damage to the buses caused by negligence.
10. Discarding of trash or food either inside or outside buses is not permitted.
11. Unruly behavior like shrieking, whistling and shouting is strictly prohibited. Courteous behavior is expected at all times.
12. The driver's attention must not be distracted for any reason.
13. Bus in-charges are responsible for maintaining discipline on the buses. Any serious offence must be reported directly to the Principal.
14. While getting down the vehicle, ensure that you have taken all your belongings.
15. Parents are requested not to pass any message through the driver or conductor.
16. The students must travel only by the buses allotted to them by the Transport-in-charge.



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

For all admission related queries please visit the school office.

1. Fill the admission form and submit it in the office.
2. Submit the photocopy of birth certificate of the child.
3. Submit the photocopy of the Aadhaar Card of the child.
4. Submit five passport size photographs of the child (two to be pasted in the Almanac in student's particular's pages, one in the personal file, one in the portfolio, one for the Id card).
5. Submit two passport size photographs of father and mother (one to be pasted in the Almanac, one in the Fetch cards for mother and father).
6. Submit three passport size photographs of local guardian (two in the student's particulars' pages, one in the Fetch Card).
7. Collect the booklist, notebook list, stationery list and Almanac after the admission procedure is completed.

WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE

1. A clear Calendar month's notice in writing or a month's fee in lieu of notice must be given before your ward can be withdrawn.
2. Those who apply for Transfer Certificate and leave the school before the start of the session will pay all dues upto March, but those leaving the school in April will have to pay all annual charges & tuition fee for the next quarter.
3. Transfer Certificate is issued only when all the dues are settled and NOC is issued by the Accounts department.
4. Security/caution deposit amount will be refunded only on producing all original receipts at the time of admission.
5. Students can be asked to leave the school on the following grounds:
 - a. Indiscipline
 - b. Unsatisfactory progress in work despite repeated efforts.

RULES CONCERNING ABSENCE & LEAVE

1. It is compulsory for the students to complete 80% of the attendance in a year to make them eligible to sit for the final evaluation.
2. A student who has been absent will not be permitted to sit in class without the letter from the parent stating the genuine reason for absence. Parents should fill up the Leave Application form.
3. Leave on medical grounds must be supported by a Medical Certificate duly signed by a doctor.
4. Students can be asked to leave the school for indiscipline, irregularity in attendance, defamation of school property, non-payment of school fees.
5. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for 6 consecutive days renders a student liable to having his/her name struck off the rolls without any notice. Re-admission may be granted after payment of fresh admission fee, at the discretion of the Principal.
6. All students are expected to attend the school on the Opening day after vacation. Absence for more than 3 days immediately after vacation renders the student liable to pay a fine of Rs. 100 per day.
7. Regular attendance ensures steady academic and personality growth.

40. Students suffering from any of the diseases like Asthma, Epilepsy, Rheumatic Heart diseases etc. are advised to be under continuous medical supervision of a specialist doctor. History of their illness must be filled in the Almanac along with the treatment being taken.
41. There will be a fruit break daily. Please ensure that your ward brings fruits daily.
42. Parents are to note that the school premise is a '**NO TOBACCO ZONE**'; they should follow this strictly when they enter the school.



CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE STUDENTS

1. Attendance of each student on all National Festivals is mandatory.
2. Students are supposed to report in proper school uniform as per the specified days, clean shoes and socks.
- 3) English speaking is compulsory for all students in school premises. Parents are requested to encourage their child/children to speak in English, read English Newspaper and books to gain confidence. Each student should possess a dictionary.
- 4) Homework /Assignment should be noted down in the Euphorite's Almanac.
- 5) Students are expected to take part in all co-curricular activities of the school.
- 6) Every student must take part in school games, physical exercises and club activities unless physically unfit or exempted by Principal/doctor.

FIELD TRIPS AND EXCURSIONS

Field trips and excursions, to widen the knowledge of students are obligatory. Parents are requested to permit their children to join these outings. Students will be escorted only by the teaching faculty during these trips.

HEALTH/MEDICATIONS

If your child is ill, do not send him/her to school. This is for your child's safety as well as the safety of the rest of the children and staff. Your child must be fever - free for 24 hours before returning to school. If your child is on antibiotics, he/she may return after being on medication for a full 24 hours and acquire a doctor's fit certificate.

If your child is suffering from any communicable disease, such as cold/cough or chicken pox, inform the Class Teacher/Principal immediately. When the child is not well and comfortable he/she should be instructed to stay at home. Parents will be called to pick up the child.

Any one with a contagious disease will not be allowed in class without a signed statement from a physician indicating that the child is no longer suffering with contagious diseases



HEALTH POLICY

The health, safety and security of the students and staff at Euphoria is of paramount importance. The school has zero tolerance for any discrepancies /shortcomings in the safety and security of people in the school campus and transport facilities.

1. The CCTV Surveillance Centre monitors the activities and movements in the campus.
2. Trained and watchful security guards are placed across the campus.
3. All school staff including teachers, drivers, conductors, care givers and maids are recruited after a three stage verification and reference check process.
4. Strict security protocols and drills are followed on all occasions, including events and outdoor visits.
5. Regular fire and emergency drills are held.
6. The entire perimeter of the campus is protected by fencing/boundary walls, as well as guards.
7. Students are not allowed to leave the premises without an Out Pass or authorized personnel.
8. Every member of the school staff will compulsorily identify themselves with School ID cards and Biometric impression for entry inside the campus building.
9. Parents are given ID cards for campus entry as well as to collect their child at bus drop-off point.

HEALTH POLICY GUIDELINES

Please keep your child at home if these symptoms or conditions occur:

1. Body temperature of over 100 degrees in the past 24 hours.
2. Exceptions may be an elevated temperature after immunization or prolonged physical activity.
3. Severe cold with a temperature elevation, sneezing or nose drainage.
4. Diarrhea – liquid stool for the last 12 hours.
5. Continued, unexplained vomiting.
6. Rashes you cannot identify or a physician has not diagnosed.
7. Ear or throat infections diagnosed by a physician.



8. It is important that you let us know if your child has been exposed to a contagious disease. Some of these are: Measles, Conjunctivitis, Chicken Pox, Mumps, Head Lice.

You know your child. If he/she is acting differently, check him/her carefully before sending the child to school. If you have any doubt, call your doctor for advice. Children exhibiting symptoms of illness will be sent home. By helping us to observe good health standards, you will be protecting your child and others in the school. The school has a well maintained Infirmary with First-Aid. Students are looked after with love and utmost care.

ANTI BULLYING POLICY

We believe that every student should enjoy our school equally, feel safe, secure, and be accepted regardless of colour, race, gender, popularity, ability, intelligence, religion and nationality. Bullying can be pushing, shoving, hitting and spitting as well as name calling, making fun of, laughing at and excluding someone. Bullying causes pain and stress to victims and is never justified or excusable inside or outside school. The victim is never responsible for being the target of bullying.

This school will not tolerate any behavior that is classified under the anti-bullying policy as bullying and will take firm steps to eliminate such behavior.

CYBER BULLYING

Students must not engage in cyber bullying activities such as -

1. Sending or posting embarrassing pictures or videos through text messages, email, facebook or websites.
2. Creating fake profiles.

Students must report any suspicion of cyber bullying to a teacher or administrator as outlined in the bullying section of this handbook.



BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

Birthday is an extremely special occasion for every child and we at Euphoria School love to celebrate birthdays. Birthdays are celebrated in the assembly and birthday boy/girl gets a privilege of coming in civil dress. The child is presented with a card and a sapling, by the school on his/her birthday so as to imbibe in them the habit of saving the environment and taking care of plants around them. Parents are advised to take their children on their birthdays to old age home or orphanage and distribute sweets, old clothes and books which will inculcate compassion and empathy in their ward.

ASSESSMENT/ EXAMINATION (CBSE):

Pre-Primary:

The children will not have any formal exam. However the mother teacher would minutely observe student's behaviour and all round development and give their remarks in grades for two terms i.e. First Term (April to September) and Second Term (October to March).

Primary:

The students of Primary wing will follow the same pattern of exam as given below.

Evaluation System:

The following evaluation system will be followed as per CBSE norms.

1. **Subject Enrichment Activities:** These are subject-specific activities aimed at enhancing the understanding and skills of the students. These activities are to be carried throughout the term, however, they should be evaluated at the term-end.
2. **Languages:** Aimed at equipping the learners to develop effective listening and speaking skills. The language teachers may devise their own methods and parameters for assessment of the languages.



3. **Mathematics:** For the activities in Mathematics, follow links on CBSE website.
4. **Science:** Practical work and activities in Science may be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT Syllabus and Text Books.
5. **Social Science:** Map or the project work may be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT Syllabus and Text Book.
6. **Record Keeping:** The CBSE affiliated schools will follow the simple documentation procedure and collate the same at the time of preparing the report card. Unnecessary lengthy and repetitive documentation by teachers must be avoided.

CHILD-CENTERED ASSESSMENT

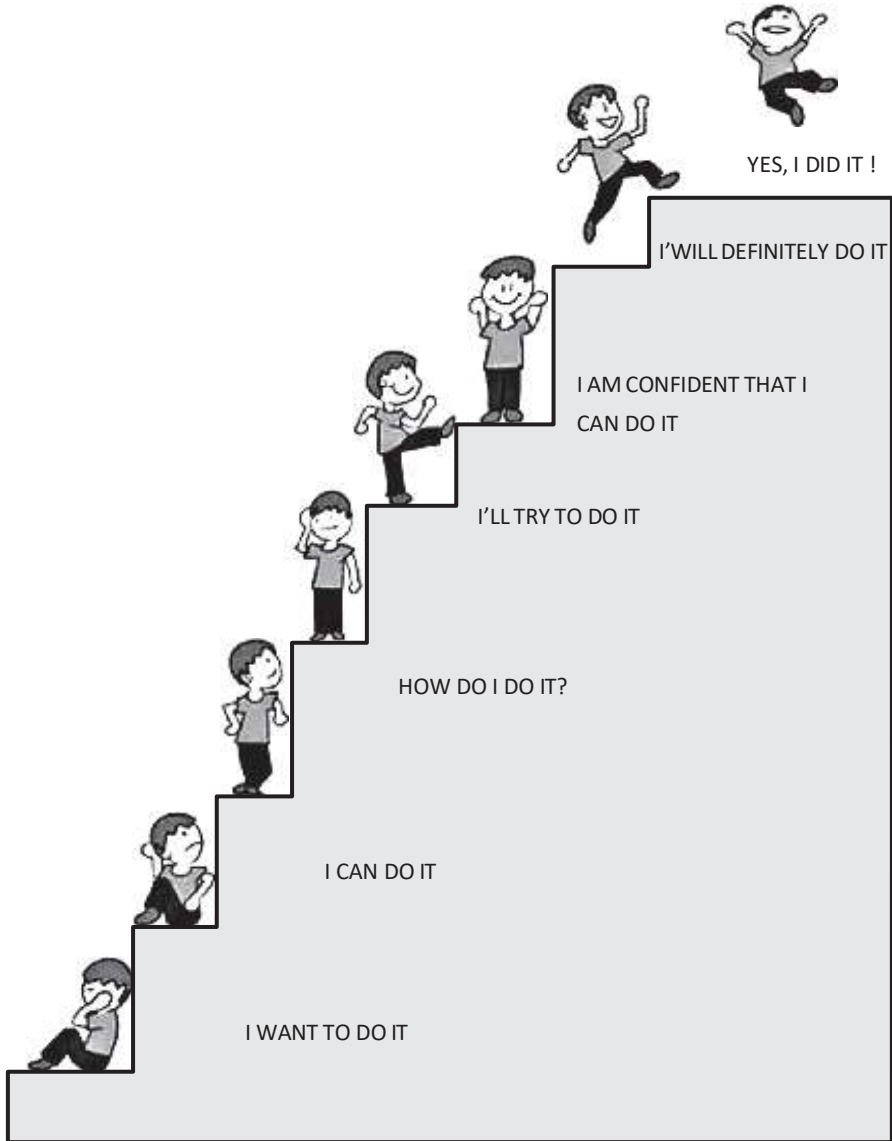
Our School follows the Child-Centered Assessment methodology. This system has the following objectives:
